Report on day's events:

Office:

- Paddock meeting schedule for 18 July to explain the new urging regulations which will take effect across Ontario commencing 1 August.
- Program error correction: Race 8 #7 CHOREOGRAPHER receives a 25% allowance for this race (Claiming \$10,000) and may be claimed for \$12,500.

Races:

- Ted McDonald excused from one drive.
 - Stephane Lareau excused from one drive.
1. Inquiry on #2 MONTANAALASKA (Michael Armstrong) who broke before the start; Mr. Armstrong reported having a knee boot down before the start; video review indicated that both knee boots were in place when #2 broke (did finish with broken equipment); #2 did receive a fair start. Clear.

 4. SOUTHWIND JERRY #3 suffered broken equipment (buxton) after the ½ mile pole and finished with broken equipment. Driver of #1 SHYTOWN SHADOW, Emil Toth, cautioned regarding his urging in the stretch. Clear.
 5. Reviewed break by #5 GHIRARDELLI LINDY (Richard Simard) who finished 5th before the ¼ mile pole; no violation of the breaking rule. ALACRITY #4 suffered broken equipment (buxton) after the ¾ mile pole and finished with broken equipment. Clear.

6. Inquiry on #1 STATE NEWS (Matt Harvey) who finished 2nd concerning possible interference to #5 MACH IMPACT (Jacques Beaudoin) before the ½ mile pole when #1 shied away from the new teletimer under construction in the infield and come out into #5; after speaking with both drivers (Mr. Beaudoin stated he was not impeded or interfered with by #1) there was no placing, although both horses were charted with interference; no violations. Clear.

The panel discussed changes to the current images on the teletimer under construction with General Manager Peter Andrusek (he will remove the images and make the board a solid colour) to reduce the anxiety caused to some horses upon viewing the structure.

8. Inquiry on #6 ROSE RUN SLIDER (Jacques Beaudoin) who finished 1st concerning possible interference to #7 CHOREOGRAPHER (Marie-Claude Auger) who finished 5th in the stretch; after speaking with both drivers (Ms. Auger stated if she had not grabbed her horse the wheel of #6 would have made contact with the front legs of her horse) and reviewing the video it was determined that #6 did cause interference to #7 in the stretch; #6 was placed 5th (AGCO rule 22.09).

Driver Jacques Beaudoin was adjudged guilty of violating AGCO rule 22.05.01 (a) (did bear out into #7 CHOREOGRAPHER in the stretch causing the driver to take her horse back and out of position) and assessed a penalty of three days driving suspension (to be served 16-18 July, inclusive) (SB 50947).

SURF REPORT #8 suffered broken equipment (lost a shoe) after the start and finished with broken equipment.
