THE ALPINE CLAIMING SERIES for Aged Mares

For \$3,000 claiming level mares. Horses must compete in both legs to be eligible for final and/or consolation. To be raced at Red Shores Charlottetown

Nomination Date: August 1st 2014

Nomination Fee: \$100 Starting Fee: \$100

First Leg August 7th 2014 \$1500

Second Leg August 12th 2014 \$1500

Consolation August 16th 2014 \$2500

Final August 16th 2014 \$3500 (added)

1. Nominations due August 1st, 2014. Those nominating horses to these events are responsible for eligibility.
2. Minimum of 14 nominations required to fill the series
3. If only 14 nominations are received, the top eight (8) money earners from the eliminations will race in the final.
4. If more than eighteen (18) nominations received, the top nine (9) money earners will race in the final, and next the top nine (9) money earners will race in the consolation.
5. In the event of a tie, the entry will be selected by lot.
6. There must be a minimum of six (6) entries for the consolation. In the event that there are fewer than six (6) entries, Red Shores reserves the right to cancel the consolation.
7. Purse distribution:
 - a. 5 or more starters: 50 — 25 — 12 — 8 — 5%;
 - b. 4 starters: 50 — 25 — 15 — 10%;
 - c. 3 starters: 60 — 30 — 10%;
 - d. 2 starters: 65 — 35%;
 - e. 1 starter: 100%.
8. Race conditions will be governed by the rules of the Maritime Provinces Harness Racing Commission and Standardbred Canada.
9. All races will be at a distance of 1 mile unless otherwise stated.
10. Post positions for all events will be drawn by the Standardbred Canada Electronic Draw.
11. Red Shores reserves the right to refuse any nomination, return fees, rearrange programs and in the event that on the day of the scheduled race, the operation of races cannot be held for any reason whatsoever, they reserve the right to reschedule the race to a future race date approved by the MPHRC or cancel it in which case all monies paid will be refunded.
12. Red Shores accepts no responsibility or liability for any accident, loss or damage, which may occur on their property as a result of these, or any races.
13. All owners, trainers, drivers must be members in good standing with the MPHRC and Standardbred Canada.
14. All horses must meet the qualifying standards of CDP.
