## Drivers

82 – Drivers have made at least one start in the Cup (final). There were two additions to the list in 2011 when Phil Hudon was 3rd and Scott Zeron 10th.

54 years, 11 months, and 8 days – William 'Bud' Fritz's age when he won the Cup with Apaches Fame in 1990 (Last trainer/driver AND oldest driver to win the Cup)

30 years, 7 months, and 10 days – Jody Jamieson's age when he won the Cup with Tell All in 2007

30 years, 4 months, and 30 days – Mark O'Mara's age when he won the Cup with Jate Lobell in 1987 (trainer / driver)

30 years, 0 months, and 9 days – Trevor Ritchie's age when he won the Cup with Quite A Sensation in 1986. Trevor is the YOUNGEST driver to WIN the Cup.

25 – Years that the winning driver was commonly known by a name consisting of 3 or 4 letters. This was the case for 15 consecutive years (1990 to 2004) when the winning drivers were commonly known as John, Mike, Ron, Dan, Luc, Dean and Cat. Brian (Sears) won in 2005 to end the streak but Ron Pierce launched a new one in 2006 and it has been extended by Jody Jamieson (2007), Paul MacDonell (2008), Ron Pierce (2009), Mark MacDonald (2010) and Jody Jamieson (2011).

22 years, 7 months, and 16 days – Tyler Buter's age when he drove Art Official in the 2008 Cup. He is believed to be the youngest driver to START in the Cup.

22 – Cups won by a Canadian-born driver. Mark O'Mara was the lone exception in the first 19 Cups. US-born drivers have won 5 of the last 8 Cups (Pierce-twice, Sears, Manzi, and Magee) but the Canadians have rebounded to win 4 of the last 5 (Jamieson-twice, MacDonald, and MacDonell).

21 – Most starts by a driver (John Campbell). Next in line are Steve Condren (15) and Doug Brown (14).

21 – Consecutive Cups were won by a catch driver. Many trainer-drivers were still active in the 1980s and 5 of the first 7 Cup winners were driven by their trainer. William 'Bud' Fritz was the last trainer to drive his Cup winner when he won with Apaches Fame in 1990.

20 – Different drivers have won 28 Cups.

16 – Drivers have won a single Cup.

14 – Most drives without a win (Doug Brown finished 7th, 8th, 3rd, 3rd, 2nd, 5th, 6th, 8th, 5th, 6th, 4th, 5th, 7th and 9th)

12 – Years since John Campbell last won the Cup in 1999.

10 – Different drivers won the first 10 Cups. All were raced at Greenwood.

10 – Different winning drivers in the last 12 years

9 – Cups have been won by the sport's top two money-winning drivers: John Campbell (6) and Mike Lachance (3)

9 – Record number of consecutive purse cheques won by John Campbell between 1986 – 1997 when he drove in 9 of 12 Cups

6 – Most wins by a driver (John Campbell with Precious Bunny, Cams Card Shark, Davids Pass, Arizona Jack, Gothic Dream and The Panderosa). Next in line are Mike Lachance with 3 wins (Safely Kept, Straight Path and Bettors Delight), Ron Pierce with 2 (Total Truth and Well Said) and Jody Jamieson with 2 (Tell All and Up The Credit).

5 – Drivers are undefeated in the Cup. John Hayes, Yves Filion, William 'Bud' Fritz, Dean Magee, and Mark O'Mara all won with their first and only starter.

4 – Longest winning streak by a driver (John Campbell won in 1994, 1995, 1996 and 1997)

3 – Drivers have finished first and last in consecutive Cups. Daniel Dube won with Gallo Blue Chip in 2000 and was 10th with Klingon Hanover in 2001. Jody Jamieson finished last with Doonbeg in 2006 and won with Tell All in 2007. Ron Pierce won with Well Said in 2009 and finished 10th with All Speed Hanover in 2010.

1 – Driver has driven back-to-back 10th place finishers. Paul MacDonell was 10th with Rustler Hanover in 1998, didn't drive in the 1999 final, and was 10th with Thunder Bay in 2000.

1 – Driver has driven back-to-back 100-1 shots. Roger Mayotte drove Negotiable who was 9th at 106-1 in 1989 and Quake Tremor

who was 8th at 109-1 in 1991. The last Cup starter that was 100-1 or higher was Stagecraft Hanover who closed at 168-1 in 1996.

A number of drivers have seemed like natural choices for the horses they drove: Dave Palone on Dave Panlone; Cat Manzi on Mantacular; Ohio-born Dave Miller on Buckeye Hanover (Ohio being the Buckeye State); Mike Lachance on Magical Mike.

## Trainers

150 – Trainers have made at least one start in the Cup (final). Three trainers were added to the list in 2011 when Erv Miller (2 starters), Ron Potter and Wayne Givens made their debut. Three more trainers will send out their first Cup starters in 2012: Jimmy Takter (2 starters), Jim Mulinix, and Virgil Morgan, Jr.

60 years, 6 months, and 1 day – Carl Jamieson's age when he won the Cup with Up The Credit in 2011. Carl is the OLDEST trainer to win the Cup.

57 years, 5 months, and 14 days – Larry Rathbone's age when he won the Cup with Mantacular in 2004.

56 years, 6 months, and 2 days – Tim Pinske's age when he won the Cup with Yankee Cruiser in 2003

55 years, 9 months, and 17 days – William Robinson's age when he won the Cup with Red River Hanover in 2002

55 years, 7 months, and 23 days – Steve Elliott's age when won the Cup with Well Said in 2009

30 years, 4 months, and 30 days – Mark O'Mara's age when he won the Cup with Jate Lobell in 1987 (trainer / driver)

30 years, 0 months, and 13 days – Casie Coleman's age when she won the Cup with Sportswriter in 2010

29 years, 8 months, and 12 days – Mark Ford's age when he won the Cup with Gallo Blue Chip in 2000

23 years, 9 months, and 24 days – Shawn Robinson's age when he won the Cup with Straight Path in 1998. Shawn Robinson is the YOUNGEST trainer to win the Cup.

21 – Consecutive Cups that were won by a trainer who employed a catch driver. Trainer-drivers were still quite prominent in the 1980s as 5 of the first 7 Cup winners were driven by their trainer. William 'Bud' Fritz was the last trainer to drive his Cup winner when he won with Apaches Fame in 1990. Last year Jody Jamieson drove the Cup winner for his father Carl but he was NOT a co-owner of Up The Credit.

17 – Years between purse cheques for trainer Blair Burgess when he 3rd with Road Machine in 1990 and won with Tell All in 2007

13 – Trainers won with their first Cup starter (John Hayes with Legal Notice, Dave Wall with Staff Director; R. Claire Porter with Quite A Sensation; Mark O'Mara with Jate Lobell; Alain Thomas with Runnymede Lobell; William 'Bud' Fritz with Apaches Fame; William Robinson with Precious Bunny; Brett Pelling with Davids Pass; Gary Machiz with Arizona Jack; Jack Darling with Gothic Dream; Mark Ford with Gallo Blue Chip; Tim Pinske with Yankee Cruiser; Brenda Teague with Total Truth; Brent MacGrath with Somebeachsomewhere)

12 – Letters in the names Brenda Teague, Casie Coleman and Linda Toscano – the first 3 female trainers to start a horse in the Cup. Tracy Brainard (13 letters) joined the list of female trainers with a Cup starter when If I Can Dream was 6th in 2009. Linda Toscano is back this year with Bettors Edge.

12 – Different trainers have won the Cup in the past 12 years. Brett Pelling won 2 of the last 13 Cups and 3 Cups in total, but no trainer has captured 2 Cups in this millennium.

11 – Most starts by a trainer (William Robinson: 11-4-2-0). Robinson actually qualified 12 Cup starters but Armbro Mackintosh was a late scratch in 1994. His sons Shawn (6 starters) and Brett (3 starters) have sent out an additional 9 horses for a total of 20 different Robinson-trained starters.

9 – Trainers are undefeated in the Cup. John Hayes, Dave Wall, R. Claire Porter, Alain Thomas, William 'Bud' Fritz, Mark O'Mara, Scott McEneny, Tim Pinske and Brent MacGrath are 1-for-1.

8 – Most starts by a trainer without a win. Stew Firlotte pupils have

finished 7th, 3rd, 8th, 5th, 4th, 5th, 7th and 9th. Robert McIntosh has sent out 7 Cup starters without a win and will send out two starters in the 2012 Cup.

5 – Starters sent out by Blair Burgess BEFORE he won with Tell All in 2007. That is the most of any trainer who HAS won the Cup. However, three trainers have sent out more starters WITHOUT winning the Cup: Chris Ryder (0/6), Bob McIntosh (0/7) and Stew Firlotte (0/8).

5 – Cup winners had a “3 word” name (Red River Hanover, Gallo Blue Chip, Cams Card Shark, Quite A Sensation, Up The Credit)

4 – Doctors of Veterinary Medicine have trained a Cup starter. (Dr. Ian Moore’s Impeccable was 8th in 2006, Dr. Pete Johnson’s Rambaran was 6th in 1997, Dr. Ken Seeber’s Jake And Elwood was 4th in 1990), Dr. John Hayes’ Legal Notice won the inaugural Cup in 1984. Dr. Moore will start State Treasurer in 2012.

4 – Consecutive Cups won by a trainer whose first name starts with “B” (Brett Pelling in 2005, Brenda Teague in 2006, Blair Burgess in 2007 and Brent MacGrath in 2008). Casie Coleman snapped that streak when Sportswriter won in 2010 and Carl Jamieson continued the mini-streak of “C” trainers when he won the 2011 Cup with Up The Credit.

4 – Trainers have picked up two cheques in the SAME year (Brenda Teague, Casie Coleman, Brett Pelling, William Robinson). Jimmy Takter and Bob McIntosh each send out two starters in 2012.

4 – Female trainers have started a horse in the Cup (Casie Coleman, Brenda Teague, Linda Toscano and Tracy Brainard). Linda Toscano is back in 2012 with Bettors Edge.

2 – Cup winning trainers were NOT born in North America. Brett Pelling was born in Matauro, New Zealand and trained winners Davids Pass, The Panderosa and Rocknroll Hanover. Tom Artandi was born in Budapest, Hungary and trained Cup winner Goalie Jeff.

## Owners

20 years, 7 months, and 18 days – Age of owner Katherine Bardis when Deuce Seelster started in the 2008 Cup. She is believed to be the youngest owner to start a horse in the Cup final. (When Isaac Waxman (Uncirculated Stable) started Dalin in the 2008 Cup he was 21 years, 0 months, and 28 days of age.)

19 – US States represented by owners or co-owners: Alabama, California, Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Kentucky, Maine, Maryland, Michigan, Minnesota, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Texas and Virginia.

6 – Canadian provinces that have been represented by owners with at least one Cup starter (Ontario, Quebec, Alberta, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, and PEI). This year marks the first start by a Saskatchewan-owned colt (State Treasurer).

1 – Country other than Canada or the US represented by a Cup starter. Simply Business starts in 2012 for a consortium of owners that includes Brixton Medical AB and Order By Stable of Sweden.

4 – Most wins by an owner or co-owner (Jeffrey Snyder with Cams Card Shark, Red River Hanover, Rocknroll Hanover and Well Said)

## Breeders, Pedigree, etc.

300,000 – Price that 2002 winner Red River Hanover sold for as a yearling and the highest price of any Cup winner. Second goes to 1999 winner The Panderosa (\$250,000), and third to 2009 winner Well Said (\$240,000).

27 – Cup winners are descendents of Hal Dale (through his sons Adios, Dale Frost, and Good Time). The only Cup winner without Hal Dale blood is Apaches Fame (by Apache Circle>Big Towner>Gene Abbe>Bert Abbe>The Abbe). All 10 starters in the 2012 Cup can be traced to Hal Dale.

26 – Cup winners bred by Americans. Only Straight Path (A. M. Cuddy Stables, Strathroy, ON) and Apaches Fame (Robert Chapple, Chatham, ON) were bred by Canadians. Sombeachsomewhere, the 2008 winner, was Ontario-sired (Mach Three) but was bred by Stephanie Smith of Saint Louisville, Ohio.

17 – ‘Hanover’ horses have started in the Cup: Red River Han-

over (1st), Rocknroll Hanover (1st), Walton Hanover (2nd), Sutter Hanover (2nd), Western Hanover (2nd), Buckeye Hanover (3rd), Peruvian Hanover (5th), Tarpaulin Hanover (5th), Cardmaster Hanover (6th), Royalfush Hanover (6th), Shadyshark Hanover (8th), Heifetz Hanover (8th), Domitian Hanover (8th), Stagecraft Hanover (9th), Klingon Hanover (10th), Rustler Hanover (10th), and All Spe-ed Hanover (10th).

## Foaling Dates

11 – Winners were foaled in March. The others were foaled in January (1), February (1), April (7), May (7), and June (1). Sweet Lou was foaled in March

7 – Winners were sired by SONS of No Nukes (Western Hanover and Jate Lobell), one was by a grandson of No Nukes (Up The Credit by Western Terror), and 4 were by sons of Most Happy Fella (all by Cam Fella).

6 – 2012 starters were foaled in March of 2009: Sweet Lou (03/04), Dapper Dude (03/09), A Rocknroll Dance (03/22), Pet Rock (03/24), State Treasurer (03/25), Bettors Edge (03/25). The other starters with foaling dates: Warrawee Needy (01/25), Time To Roll (04/24), Thinking Out Loud (04/27), and Simply Business (05/03). Warrawee Needy is the oldest of the group at 1241 days and Simply Business is the youngest at 1143 days.

4 – Michael Del Zotto’s number which was chosen in homage to Boston Bruins great Bobby Orr. The connections of Sweet Lou chose Post 4 for the Cup despite the fact that no winner has come from Post 4 since the Greenwood era. When Bobby Orr was inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame in 1979 at age 31, he was the youngest to achieve that honor. Elimination winner Dapper Dude will be driven by John Campbell who in 1990 at age 35 became the youngest person inducted into harness racing’s Hall of Fame in Goshen, NY.

3 – Number of NHL players from the town of Stouffville, Ontario. Del Zotto hails from Stouffville, which is the hometown of Stanley Cup winning players Keith Acton (with Edmonton) and Brad May (with Anaheim). WEG racing analyst Mike Hamilton was born and raised in Stouffville but after 15 years in House League with a skill-set that peaked at about age 8, an NHL career was out of the question.

Major Bombay was 8th in his Cup elim and the 3rd place finisher from the Wilson, Mybrot-hergeorge, did not start in last week's Cup elims.  
0 – Horses have WON the Wilson at 2 and the Cup at 3. Allamerican Native won the Wilson in 2002 and came back to finish 2nd in a dead-heat in the 2003 Cup. Modern Art won the 2003 Wilson but finished 5th in his Cup elim and failed to make the final. Village Jolt won the 2004 Wilson but finished 7th in his Cup elim and failed to make the final in 2005. Western Ace won the 2005 Wilson and was 5th in the Cup in 2006. Fox Valley Barzgar won the 2006 Wilson but did not make a pari-mutuel start at age three. Dali won the 2007 Wilson and finished 8th in the 2008 Cup. Major In Art won the 2008 Wilson and was reportedly ready to qualify in May of 2009 but never did make a pari-mutuel start at age three. Windfall Blue Chip won the 2009 Wilson but failed to get another cheque at age two and skipped the Cup after finishing 8th in the Burlington. Fashion Delight won the 2010 Wilson but did not make

a start in June of his three-year-old season. The 2011 Wilson was won by Major Bombay who wound up 8th in his Cup elim and did not qualify for the final.

One More Laugh won the 2009 GC and was 7th in the NA Cup. On the other hand, Well Said made a break and finished 10th in the 2008 GC but DID come back to win the 2009 NA Cup. Big Jim won the GC in 2010 and was the 1-2 morning line favourite to win his Cup elim in 2011 but finished third in both the elim and Cup final. The 2011 GC went to A Rocknroll Dance who WILL start in this year's Cup.

1 – Cup winner was third in his division of the Burlington/SBSW (Tell All)

1 – Cup winner started but did NOT get a cheque in his division of the Burlington/SBSW (Davids Pass was 8p7)

\* Formerly the Burlington Stakes

## Metro Stakes

5 – (of 23) Metro Stakes winners came back to win the Cup: Presidential Ball (1992/1993), Gothic Dream (1996/1997), Rocknroll Hanover (2004/2005), Somebeachsomewhere (2007/2008) and Sportswriter (2009/2010). Last year's Metro Stakes winner Simply Business squeaked into this year's Cup with a 5th place finish in his elimination.

## O'Brien Awards

7 – Cup winners in the last 12 years went on to win the O'Brien Award at year-end (Up The Credit, Well Said, Somebeachsomewhere, Tell All, Rocknroll Hanover, Bettors Delight and Gallo Blue Chip)

4 – O'Brien Award winners at age two came back to win the Cup at 3, in the 20 years that an O'Brien has been awarded. Presidential Ball did it in 1992/1993, Bettors Delight in 2000/2001, Somebeachsomewhere in 2007/2008 and Sportswriter in 2009/2010. The 2011 O'Brien Award-winning two-year-old was Warrawee Needy.

## Dan Patch Awards

7 – Cup winners were voted 3YO Colt Pacer of the Year in the United States. That includes just 3 of the first 21 Cup winners (Precious Bunny in 1991, Cams Card Shark in 1994 and Gallo Blue Chip in 2000) and 4 of the last 7 Cup winners (Rocknroll Hanover in 2005, Total Truth in 2006, Tell All in 2007, and Somebeachsomewhere in 2008). In 2010 Rock N Roll Heaven was 4th in the Cup but came back to win the Little Brown Jug and Breeders Crown,

and was named Three-Year-Old Colt Pacer of the Year in the US AND Canada. Roll With Joe had to settle for second in the 2011 Cup but he did win 3YO Colt Pacer of the Year honors in the US.

## Breeders Crown

2 – Breeders Crown (2YO Colt Pace) winners came back to win the Cup at 3 (Bettors Delight did it in 2000/2001 and Well Said in 2008/2009). All Speed Hanover won the 2YO Breeders Crown in 2009 but was 10th and last in the 2010 Cup. Sportswriter was 2nd by a head in the Crown and did win the Cup.

## Little Brown Jug

5 – Cup winners went on to win the Little Brown Jug (Goalie Jeff, Precious Bunny, Bettors Delight, Tell All and Well Said)

## Horse Names

40 – Starters with a "one word" name. Of those 40, only Sombeachsomewhere, Mantacular and Sportswriter managed to win the Cup. Seven horses with a "one word" name have finished second (Squiter, Neutrality, Stout, Workplace, Tyberwood, Artesian and Metropolitan) and seven finished third (Pinocchio, Kingsbridge, Megamind, Camotion, Horselaughter, Mcardle, Panspaciflight). In the 27 years that the Cup has been raced, and only Somebeachsomewhere, Mantacular and Sportswriter won with a "one word" name, a grand total of 9 Thoroughbreds with a "one word" name have won the Kentucky Derby (Barbaro, Giacomo, Monarchos, Charismatic, Grindstone, Unbridled, Alysheba, Ferdinand and Swale). Ironically, when Mantacular won the Cup in 2004 EACH of the top three finishers had a "one word" name as Metropolitan was second and Panspaciflight was third. Some of the better "one word" horses that failed to win the Cup have been: Guts, Astreos, Camotion, Artesian, McArdle, Riyadh, Stout, Workplace (who had the lead at the top of the stretch but broke and finished second) and Dali. In 2006 the "one word" starters were Doonbeg and Impeccable. Both made breaks. The only "one word" name in the 2007 field was Artriverderci and he drew post 10. In 2008 there were 2 starters with a one word name. Somebeachsomewhere won and Dali was 8th. In 2009 Annieswesterncard finished 9th. The 2011 Cup included Foreclosure N (4th), Eighteen (7th) and Rockabillie (9th). Perhaps Bill O'Donnell would have had better luck in the Cup had he not be paired with names like Guts, Laag and Camtastic.

20 – Cup winners had a "two word" name

9 – Starters with a gambling, card game or poker-themed name: Bettors Edge (2012), Annieswesterncard (2009), Western Ace (2006), Load The Dice (2005), Bettors Delight (2001), Cardmaster Hanover (2001), Aces N Sevens (2000), Royalflush Hanover (1999), Cams Card Shark (1994).

8 – Letters and spaces in the shortest name of a Cup winner (Tell All). Pet Rock would tie this record if he were to win the 2012 Cup.

6 – Starters with a space or flight-themed name: Jeremes Jet (2006), Panspaciflight (2004), Execujet (2003), Mach Three (2002), Pacific Rocket (1994), Direct Flight (1992)

4 – Letters and spaces in the shortest name of a Cup starter (Guts, Laag, Dali).

5 – Cup winners started with the letter S

3 – Cup winners started with the letter G

3 – Cup winners started with the letter R

3 – Cup winners started with the letter T

2 – Cup winners started with the letter A

2 – Cup winners started with the letter P

1 – Cup winner started with the letter B, C, D, J, L, M, Q, U, W and Y

4 – Letters in "Nero" which is the shortest name of the SIRE of a Cup winner (Runnymede Lobell)

2 – Cup starters with a hockey-themed name (Sutter Hanover and Goalie Jeff)

4430 – Mohawk's street address (4430 Guelph Line)

3000 – Number of 25th Anniversary ball caps distributed in 2008

312 – Highway 401 exit number for the Guelph Line

261 – Horses have started in 28 Cups

155 – Most lifetime starts of a Cup winner at retirement (Quite A Sensation)

138.10 – Stonebridge Tonic's Show price in the 2010 Burlington Stakes (when Rock N Roll Heaven missed the board)

120.80 – Mach Dreamer's Show price in the 2010 Burlington Stakes (when Rock N Roll Heaven missed the board)

53 – Number of wins that Gallo Blue Chip had when he retired (most of any Cup winner). Next in line are Quite A Sensation who retired with 49 wins and Apaches Fame who retired with 34 wins.

42.40 – Twin B Warrior's Show price in the 2010 Burlington Stakes (when Sportswriter missed the board)

28 – Editions of the Cup raced through 2011. The 2012 Cup will be the 28th edition (Cup XXIX).

26 – Cup winners raced at age two. Only Straight Path and Tell All did NOT race at 2.

22 – Cup winners retired\* with more than \$1 million in lifetime earnings. The last Cup winner to retire with less than \$1 million was Straight Path who retired in 1999 with \$660,830. (\*Includes 2011 Cup winner Up The Credit who was still racing in May of 2012)

22 – The wedding anniversary celebrated by Paul MacDonell on June 14, 2008 – the night he won 2 major stakes (Elegantimage with Lantern Kronos and North America Cup with Somebeachsomewhere). The number "two" popped up a number of times on that night. Somebeachsomewhere paced in 1:49 for the second consecutive win; Somebeachsomewhere was Paul's second winner on the card (he won earlier with Rhinestone Phantom); Somebeachsomewhere became the second horse with a "one word" name to win the Cup and he was just the second Cup winner to wear the #2 saddle pad (Legal Notice did in 1984 but Tell All wore pad #3 when he started from post 2 in 2007).

21 – Date in July, 2003 that Yankee Cruiser won the Cup. The three-quarter time in that race was 1:21, the 3-2 exactor paid \$21.30, and on that very day the Billboard chart-topper was "21 Questions" by 50 Cent.

21 – Most wins by a starter prior to the Cup final (Jate Lobell in 1987)

14 – Cups in which at least one horse made a break.

14 – Cups contested without any horse making a break.

12 – Years since John Campbell last won the Cup in 1999. Since his last win, Campbell has finished 2nd with Mach Three, Metropolitan, Feelin Friskie and Art Colony, 4th with Cams Fool and Artriverderci, 7th with Twin B Champ, 8th with Yankee Blitz, and 9th with Deuce Seelster. He was injured and did not start in the 2003 Cup and sat out the 2011 Cup while recuperating from a spill at Harrah's Chester (Philly) on May 30, 2011. He will, however, drive Dapper Dude in the 2012 Cup.

11 – Date in May that 2008 Cup starter Dali was electronically registered (2007) AND the date in May (1904) that his namesake Salvador Dali was born.

11 – Cups have been sponsored by Pepsi (2001 - 2011).

07/02/1984 – Date of the inaugural Cup for which eliminations and final were raced on the same Monday evening card at Greenwood Racetrack in downtown Toronto. Program advertising at the time noted that it was "one day after Canada's birthday and 2 days before the American national holiday."

9 – Cup winners retired with more than \$2 million in earnings.

9 – Cup winners went on to win the Meadowlands Pace. The latest was Well Said who took the M-Pace by 6 lengths in 2009. Preceding him were Rocknroll Hanover, Red River Hanover, Gallo Blue Chip, The Panderosa, Davids Pass, Cams Card Shark, Presidential Ball, and Precious Bunny. In 2007 Tell All came back to finish 2nd in the Meadowlands Pace. In 2008 Somebeachsomewhere turned in one of the most impressive efforts of his career but lost by a neck to Art Official in 1:47. 2010 Cup winner Sportswriter was

retired immediately after finishing 7th in the Pace. 2011 Cup champion Up The Credit was 6th in his Meadowlands Pace elim but did win the Consolation.

8 – Age at which Cup winners Gallo Blue Chip and Quite A Sensation retired (oldest)

5 – Cup winners retired with less than \$1 million in earnings (Legal Notice, Staff Director, Safely Kept, Arizona Jack, Straight Path)

5 – Cup winners retired with a lifetime record taken in the Cup (Yankee Cruiser, Red River Hanover, Straight Path, Gothic Dream and Sportswriter)

5 – Announcers have called the North America Cup (Earl Lennox, Dan Loiselle, John Crake, Frank Salive and Ken Middleton)

4-1/2 – Largest win margin (Bettors Delight in 2001)

4 – Wire-to-wire winners (Staff Director, Jate Lobell, Precious Bunny and Rocknroll Hanover)

3 – Cup winners went on to earn more than \$3 million (Rocknroll Hanover, Gallo Blue Chip and Presidential Ball).

3 – Cup winners retired with a record taken on a 5/8-mile track (Staff Director, Quite A Sensation, Apaches Fame)

3 – Cup winners retired with more than \$3 million in earnings (Gallo Blue Chip, Rocknroll Hanover, Presidential Ball)

3 – Cup winners retired with fewer than 10 wins. Straight Path, Arizona Jack and Sportswriter each retired with 8 wins. 2011 Cup champion Up The Credit was still racing in May of 2012 with 8 wins to his credit.

3 years, 4 months, 23 days – age of the oldest Cup winner (Straight Path who was foaled January 28, 1995 and won the Cup on June 20, 1998). Warrawee Needy was foaled on January 25, 2009 and would be the oldest Cup winner should he get the job done in 2012.

3 years, 0 months, 19 days – age of the youngest Cup winner (Davids Pass who was foaled June 5, 1992 and won the Cup on June 20, 1995)

2 – Millionaires have won the Cup. Presidential Ball (\$1,234,104) won in 1993 and Bettors Delight (\$1,093,411) took the 2001 Cup.

2 – Cup winners did NOT race at age two (Straight Path and Tell All)

2 – Cup starters had just 1 win going into the final (Cams Catch was 5th in 1995 and Artriverderci was 4th in 2007).

2 – Winners of The Diplomat Series (previously the Mohawk Series) went on to win the Cup (Tell All in 2007 and Up The Credit in 2011)

2 hours, 24 minutes, 24 seconds – Time that Tom Longboat, an Onandaga Indian from Hamilton, Ontario took to win the 1907 Boston Marathon (a record at the time). He defeated, among others, 1908 Olympic champion John J. Hayes. In 1984 another John Hayes won the first North America Cup with Legal Notice. Finishing third in the inaugural Cup was **Long Fella** and driver **Tom Harmer**.

2 – Date in July of the latest Cup (elims and final for the inaugural Cup were raced on the same program – Monday, July 2, 1984. The last 27 Cups have been held in June.

2 – Major highways (Don Valley Parkway and Gardiner Expressway) were closed on the night that Presidential Ball won the final Cup at Greenwood. Traffic in the downtown Toronto was chaotic. While traffic congestion wasn't a factor when the 2010 Cup was contested at Mohawk, there were numerous road closures in the Toronto area as motorcades traveled between Pearson Airport and the downtown Toronto for the G20 Summit.

2 – Geldings have won the Cup (Quite A Sensation and Gallo Blue Chip). Bettors Edge will be the lone gelding in the 2012 Cup.

1-2-3 – When Rocknroll Hanover won the Cup in 2005 it was the first Cup win for driver Brian Sears, the second for co-owner Lothlorien Equestrian, and the third for co-owner Jeffrey Snyder and trainer Brett Pelling. Lothlorien and Snyder co-owned Red River Hanover while Snyder also owned 1994 Cup champion Cams Card Shark. Pelling also won the Cup with Davids Pass in 1995 and The Panderosa in 1999.

1 – Cup winner retired with more than \$4 million in earnings (Gallo Blue Chip)

1 – Cup winner retired with a lifetime record taken on a half-mile track (Legal Notice, 1:53.3 at Delaware, OH)

1 – Number of wins that Mantacular had from 16 starts AFTER winning the Cup. He retired after finishing 5th in the Progress Pace in November of his 3-year-old season.

1 – Cup starter came into the final with sub-1:50 wins at age two AND three (Somebeachsomewhere). Sweet Lou and Warrawee Needy will be the second and third additions to the list when they start in 2012.

1 – Cup finish time has stood up as that year's fastest mile by a three-year-old pacer (Red River Hanover, 1:48.4 in 2002)

1 – Cup winner retired with more than \$4 million in earnings (Gallo Blue Chip)

1 – Cup winner retired with a lifetime record taken on a 1/2-mile track (Legal Notice, 1:53.3 at Delaware, Ohio)

1 – Dead-Heat in Cup history (Allamerican Native & Artesian were tied for second in 2003)

0 – Number of wins that Sportswriter had after winning the Cup in 2010. He finished 4th in the Meadowlands Pace elimination and 7th in the final.

0 – Maidens have started in the Cup final.

## Sweet Lou / Warrawee Needy Trivia

- SWEET LOU was foaled on March 4, 2009. Several hours before he won his NA Cup elimination, the thoroughbred UNION RAGS won the Belmont Stakes. Union Rags was foaled one day earlier than Sweet Lou on March 3, 2009.

- SWEET LOU was foaled in Milton, Pennsylvania (about 50 miles or 80 km north of Harrisburg). The town of less than 7000 inhabitants is the birthplace of Ettore Boiardi (1897–1985), AKA "Chef Boyardee".

- As a son of Yankee Cruiser and Sweet Future, SWEET LOU was almost certainly named in honor of former New York Yankees manager Louis Victor (Sweet Lou) Piniella.

- In winning his elimination in 1:47.4, SWEET LOU lowered the previous Canadian record of 1:48.1 which was set in the 2009 Cup final by WELL SAID.

- Dave Palone drove the colt Dave Panlone to a 4th place finish in the 2009 Cup.

- Dave Palone is closing in on Herve Filion's record of 15,180 career wins. Ironically, Filion made only one appearance in a Cup final. After winning his elimination, Filion finished 6th in the 1984 Cup with a horse named EMBRACE ME.

- Dave Palone was born on February 26, 1962. That same day the US Supreme court disallowed race separation on public transportation.

- According to Wikipedia, "Palone became interested in harness racing after his father took him to watch the Adios Stakes in 1976." Canadian-owned Armbr Ranger and PEI-born trainer-driver Joe O'Brien won the race. In 2006 Dave Palone would drive a horse named PALONE RANGER for PEI-born trainer Greg Peck.

- SWEET LOU has a freeze brand "0G412" on the right side of his neck.

- Ron Burke was born on October 10, 1969. That same day the 100-1 shot NY Mets beat the Baltimore Orioles 5-3 to win the 66th World Series.

- Although born in Washington, Pennsylvania, Ron Burke now resides in Canonsburg, PA (population 8,992 in 2010). Canonsburg is the birthplace of singers Perry Como, Bobby Vinton and the members of The Four Coins.

- SWEET LOU is actually the second Standardbred to be registered with that name. The first SWEET LOU was foaled on March 4, 1975 -- 34 years to the day before the current SWEET LOU was foaled on March 4, 2009. The original SWEET LOU won 40 of his 123 career starts and retired with earnings of \$96,827.

- SWEET LOU is a son of YANKEE CRUISER who took is 1:49.3 lifetime record in winning the 2003 Cup.

- SWEET LOU's \$2.3 million winning brother BETTOR SWEET made his first appearance in a Meadowlands qualifier on June 16, 2007. He won the qualifier in 2:00.1. Later that same day, TELL ALL won the first Pepsi North America Cup to be contested at Mo-

hawk.

- According to Wikipedia, the PET ROCK was a "1970s fad conceived in Los Gatos, California by advertising executive Gary Dahl. The fad lasted about six months, ending after a short increase in sales during the Christmas season of December 1975. Although by February 1976 they were discounted due to lower sales, Dahl sold **1.5 million** Pet Rocks and became a millionaire." The purse for the Pepsi North America Cup is **\$1.5 million**.

60 years, 6 months, and 1 day – Carl Jamieson's age when he won the Cup with Up The Credit in 2011. Carl is the oldest trainer to win the Cup.

25 – Years that the winning driver was commonly known by a name consisting of 3 or 4 letters. This was the case for 15 consecutive years (1990 to 2004) when the winning drivers were commonly known as John, Mike, Ron, Dan, Luc, Dean and Cat. Brian (Sears) won in 2005 to end the streak but Ron Pierce launched a new one in 2006 and it has been extended by Jody Jamieson (2007), Paul MacDonell (2008), Ron Pierce (2009), Mark MacDonald (2010) and Jody Jamieson (2011).

6 – Sets of fathers and sons have driven in separate Cups. (Bill and Tom Houghton, Yves and Sylvain Filion, Ron and Randy Waples, Carl and Rod Allen, Carl and Jody Jamieson, and Rick and Scott Zeron)

4 – Consecutive Cups won by a trainer whose first name starts with "B" (Brett Pelling in 2005, Brenda Teague in 2006, Blair Burgess in 2007 and Brent MacGrath in 2008). Casie Coleman snapped that streak when Sportswriter won in 2010 and Carl Jamieson continued the mini-streak of "C" trainers when he won the 2011 Cup with Up The Credit.

0 – Starts at age three by Warrawee Needy prior to his Cup elimination. In the past Total Truth and The Panderosa have entered the Cup elims with one start at age three. On the other end of the scale, Staff Director had 18 sophomore starts prior to his Cup elimination and 19 starts prior to his Cup win in 1985.
