### **Understanding the Purse Account**

In simple terms, purse money is the amount of funds available for horse racing purses.

"A purse account is where the revenue from a variety of sources is held for racing," said Rob McKay, speaking on behalf of the Implementation and Monitoring (IM) Group. "The purse account is maintained by the racetrack, which serves as the purse account manager, and is overseen by the Ontario Racing Commission (ORC). On average, the majority of revenue to the purse account comes from the slots (about 70% provincially) but there are other revenue streams as well."

McKay, who has 30 years experience in racing, first as a Race Secretary and now as an ORC Racing Official, pointed out that, on average, close to 99 % of purse money earned every year is paid out every year. "But this amount includes other approved uses of purse money."
